A Story of God's Provision

A Dream by the Nile

Ibba Girls' Boarding School was once nothing more than a dream. Bridget Nagomoro had been the only woman from her village of Ibba to have ever completed secondary education, and in 2008 she met Professors John Benington and Jean Hartley who had been invited by the interim government in South Sudan to run workshops on public management. During one of these workshops, sitting beside the Nile at lunchtime, Bridget told John about a recent dream she had had, calling her to set up a school for girls back home in Ibba.

By the grace of God, and with the prayer and generosity of several churches in the UK, enough funds were raised to construct school buildings on land donated by Bridget and the village chief, Severio, and to employ the first teachers. Ibba Girls' Boarding School welcomed its first cohort of 40 girls in 2011, and thanks to God's continued provision, the school was able to add another class of girls each year and reach a capacity of 360 students from Primary 4 through to Secondary 4.



Bridget went on to complete an Open University Masters, and was presented with her certificate at a ceremony at Ibba Girls' Boarding School.

A Unifying School

The school is a beacon of hope and unity for the local community, and its board of governors brings together community leaders from a range of backgrounds, including representatives of both Roman Catholic and Episcopal churches (those being the two largest faith groups in the community). The school is run with Christian values while being welcoming to girls of any faith or none, and of any tribe and background, building friendship and shared understanding across communities. Regular services of prayer and worship are held at the school, with visiting church leaders of different denominations.

Hope for the Future

The young women who complete their secondary education at Ibba Girls' Boarding School will have greatly improved prospects for themselves, and they will also lift the development level of whole communities as they share their learning and serve in healthcare, education, agriculture, business, or politics. For those that go on to have children and grandchildren, they will have better prospects too. Girls' education truly has a broad and multi-generational impact on communities.

So we hope you will join us in giving thanks for all that God has done so far and in praying for continued provision in the months and years to come. With the loving prayers and generosity of supporters like you, more girls will be able to access a good education in South Sudan.

How Your Church Can Help

Making a Long Term Impact

By making a regular commitment to pray or give, you can multiply your impact and invest in the futures of the girl students. Please consider:

- Including prayers for Ibba Girls' School in your services once a month.
- Starting a regular donation as a church—whether a small amount every month or a larger amount once a year. You could:
 - ⇒ Give £70 a month to completely cover the costs of educating one girl student.
 - ⇒ Give £2,700 a year to completely cover the pay of a cook, and so keep the students and staff well fed.
 - ⇒ Tithe from your church's building project, as one church in Nottingham did over several years. For example, a water storage tower costs about £25,000.
